Local Tax Base / Revenue Declining


Infrastructure Deteriorating / Not Built

Public Safety Costs Rising






# Total Employment Change 2000 to 2012










# Population Change 2000 to 2012











# Population Change 2010 to 2012












#### **Change in Retail Sales: 2007-2013**


 Counties lack funds to pay salaries and maintain roads

## Options for Providing Services to Arkansas County Residents

- Reduce Services
- Increase revenue
  - Alternative (new) revenue sources
    - User charges,
    - shift tax burden to non-residents
  - Expand the tax base
  - Increase tax rates
- Increase cost effectiveness
  - Improve management and productivity
  - Explore possibility of privatizing services
  - Consider intergovernmental agreements

- Share resources / work with county officials
- Develop educational program for citizens
  - With support of county officials
- Promote Interlocal Agreements







### **Engaging Agents, Officials & Public**

- > Agents numerous demands
  - ➤ Less funding fewer agents
- > Agents mostly Ag & FCS training
- > County officials
  - > Difficult to Change / want to keep status quo
  - > Look to other sources for assistance
  - ➤ Not sure trust CES in new role
